

# TO CATCH A WEASEL

*32 bar Jig for 3 couples – McMurtry 2005*

- 1-4 1st couple dance in for one step and cast off one place. 2nd couple step up on bars 3 & 4.
- 5-8 1st couple with nearer hands, dance between 3rd couple and cast up one place to end through facing first corners.
- 9-16 1st couple turn corners right hands, partner left hands, second corners right hands and partner left hands facing first corner, again.
- 17-24 1st man passing right shoulders, dance around first corner and between 3rd couple, dancing left round 3rd man all the way and end in second place on own side. Meanwhile 1st woman passing right shoulders, dance around first corner and between 2nd couple, dance left round 2nd woman all the way and end in second place on own side (Fig. 1).
- 25-32 2nd, 1st and 3rd couples circle six hands round and back. Repeat having passed a couple.

**Dance Notes:** On bar 24, 1st couple should arrive just in time to flow into a circle.
