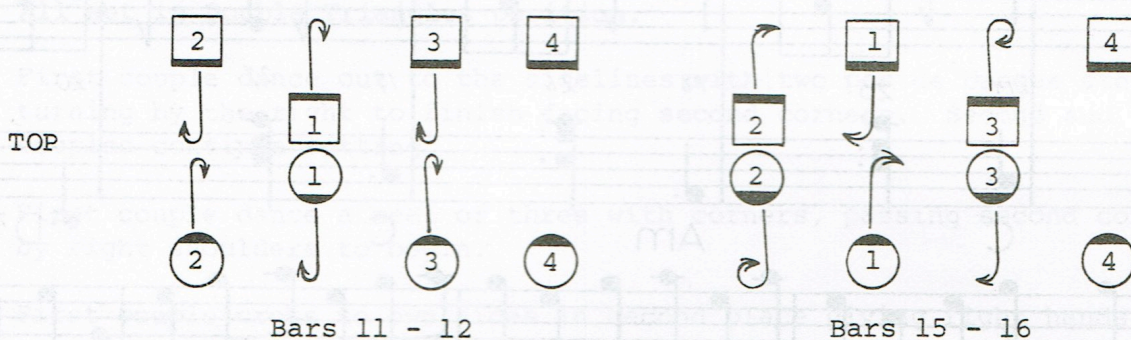


GARY MORRIS

A 32 bar jig for three couples.

- 1 - 2 First and second couples set once, nearer hands joined on the side.
- 3 - 4 First couple dance in to face down (nearer hands joined) while second couple cast up one place.
- 5 - 8 First couple dance down between third couple, cast up one place and dance in to finish back to back in the middle facing own side.
- 9 - 10 All join hands as for Double Triangles and set once.
- 11 - 12 First couple (with two pas de basque) dance out to own side and turn by the right to face in while second and third couples (with two pas de basque) dance into the middle turning by the right to finish back to back with partner.



- 13 - 14 All join hands in a reversed Double Triangles formation and set once.
- 15 - 16 First couple (with two pas de basque) dance into the middle and turn to the right to finish with first man facing third man and first woman facing second woman while second and third couples (with two pas de basque) dance out to own side turning by the right to face into the set.
- 17 - 22 Second, first and third couple dance reels of three on own side - first man passing third man by right shoulder and first woman passing second woman by right shoulder to begin.
- 23 - 24 All cross to opposite side giving partner right hands in passing.
- 25 - 30 Second, first and third couples dance reels of three on opposite side - first man passing second man by right houlder and first woman passing third woman by right shoulder to begin.
- 31 - 32 All cross to own side giving partner right hands in passing.

Repeat having passed a couple.
