4. Reports

a) **President's Report**

b) Treasurer's Report

Speaking to her report Sarah Epps noted that the Wellington Region is financially sound and that they have made a small surplus from events in the past year. The Fugues class ran at a slight loss. However, as the financial year ends on 31st August this will affect the 2026 financial reporting.

6. Region appointments

7. Officers' expenses

8. Delegates for Branch AGM

No advice could be given to potential delegates until we receive the papers from the Branch. Elaine Laidlaw suggested a meeting could be held in Carterton prior to the Carterton Annual Dance.

9. Region delegates at the RSCDS 95th AGM

The meeting noted that Joy Tracey and Lee Miller will be the delegates.

10. Region classes and events discussion

Those attending the meeting raised the following points.

- Costs are currently being covered but the Region could be more proactive in ringing round to raise attendance, noting that people always prefer to turn up on the day rather than pre-register.
- Before a class is cancelled the Region should give notice to clubs that this will happen because registrations are too low.
- The intermediate class could be more specific as to which formations would be taught as this might make the class more attractive.
- It was suggested the intermediate class could be split into intermediate, followed the
 next year by upper intermediate, the latter being preparation for moving to the
 advanced classes. However, there was concern this might spilt the cohort. A further
 suggestion was that upper intermediate classes could be run on two Saturday
 afternoons.
- There was concern that generally step work was deteriorating but it was noted that step work is currently part of all classes. Perhaps this needs to be emphasised in the class guidelines.
- The maximum length of a class or event should be three hours.
- There was some concern that musicians are currently paid more per hour than tutors.
 Even though the low tutor fees reflect the fact that the history of the organisation is voluntary this issue needs to be examined. However, just raising tutor fees may make classes too expensive so this also needs to be considered. It was observed that classes can always use recorded music.

11. Other Business

- Elaine Laidlaw suggested being proactive in inviting new dancers outside the Region to the NDC, noting that they will often be accompanied by more experienced dancers from outside the Region. Maybe the NDC guidelines should be revised accordingly.
- Elaine Lethbridge noted the dance.scottish gmail address does not seem to be working and suggested communication should be via club email addresses. However, club secretaries also need to tell Region when the addresses change. It was suggested the Region send out recommendations for improved email communication.
- Elaine Laidlaw reminded the meeting the Carterton 25th anniversary dance was on 29th November and due to other events in the town that weekend it would be wise to book accommodation soon.
